Latin American Community Center Sponsorship Package Proposal

Organization Background

The Latin American Community Center (LACC) was founded in 1969 by Puerto Rican immigrants and community leaders who sought to establish a resource center. Over the years, the LACC has transformed dramatically from a small, grassroots agency in a red brick row house to the largest Latino serving organization that serves more than 7,500 individuals annually. The LACC is a beacon of hope for many Hispanics in the local community, and a vital community anchor in Wilmington's Hilltop neighborhood, the most densely populated area in Delaware with one of the highest concentrations of children.

The LACC provides holistic wraparound programs and services as well as advocates for low-income children, youth and families in a bilingual, safe, and culturally-specific environment. More than 30 programs are offered in two strategically focused tracks: Lifelong Learning, which offers a broad spectrum of educational services, from ages 6-weeks to 18 years; and Life Empowerment, which helps low- and moderate- income (LMI) minority individuals and families achieve or reestablish self-sufficiency. In addition, with a staff of more than 100 employees from 17 countries (95% of whom are fluent in more than one language), the LACC has the highest concentration of professional bilingual and/or bicultural employees in Delaware.

We are committed to strengthening the community and fulfilling our mission. This important work would be impossible without the support we receive from government sources, local organizations and businesses, and families and individuals throughout Delaware.

Minerva Marrero Hispanic Scholarship Program

The Latin American Community Center's Minerva Marrero Hispanic Scholarship Program provides monetary scholarships for Hispanic Seniors in the State of Delaware to support their post-secondary education. The program was named after Minerva Marrero, one of the founders of the Hispanic Student Recognition Program. It is an honor to name this program after Minerva so that her legacy of advocating for the success of Hispanic students continues each and every day.

Award recipients of the Minerva Marrero Hispanic Scholarship Program will receive funds to help finance their associates, bachelors or trade school tuition. In 2025 Scholarships will be awarded in 3 tiers: \$5,000, \$3,000; and \$2,000. The tier a student is eligible for is based on financial need. Recipients will be selected based on their academic achievement, community involvement and review of submitted supplementary materials.

About LACC Early Learning Centers

LACC Early Childhood Services operates 3 La Fiesta Early Learning Centers that provide high quality, bilingual education for Delaware's youngest learners. The LACC opened La Fiesta 2 in April of 2023 in Wilmington, DE. It has a capacity of serving 104 children ages 6 weeks to 2 years old. La Fiesta 3 opened in March of 2024 in New Castle, DE and has a capacity of serving 86 children ages 6 weeks to 5 years old.

Our infant and toddler classrooms are Spanish immersion, meaning teachers speak with children almost entirely in Spanish throughout the day. For children whose home language is Spanish, they are able to build a strong foundation in their home language so they do not later loose Spanish language skills. For our children whose home language is English, this format gives them the opportunity to learn Spanish naturally as they are developing language skills. In our infant classrooms we follow each child's feeding and sleeping schedule and offer activities to help infants achieve developmental milestones like crawling and using first words. Our toddler classrooms have a more structured routine with scheduled times for meals, naps, and both indoor and outdoor play.

Once students are in our preschool classrooms, instruction is delivered in both English and Spanish on alternating weeks, with the goal of helping children develop language and pre-literacy skills in both languages before entering kindergarten. Preschool classrooms have daily times for group meetings, reading, and planned activities while still spending much of their time in free play. We find that 90 to 95% of our graduating preschoolers are meeting or exceeding the state of Delaware's benchmarks for kindergarten readiness and have also found anecdotally that our students are reading in both English and Spanish by second grade.

Classrooms use the research-based creative curriculum across all ages to encourage learning through exploration as well as a social-emotional curriculum called "Conscious Discipline" which helps children develop self-regulation and problem-solving skills through daily classroom routines and special lessons.

The LACC places no limit on the number of Purchase of Care (POC) families it accepts, offers low to no cost childcare slots to eligible families through both the Early Head Start and State Funded Early Care and Education Program, and offers additional financial assistance to families to make sure programming is accessible to all families regardless of income.
